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### **Programs**

#### June 11 Meeting - Research Trip to Mid-Continent Genealogy Library

On June 11, we will have an all-day Research Trip to *Mid-Continent Library* in Independence, MO. Mid-Continent is the largest genealogy library in this region of the U.S. Listings of the library's holdings are available in the Nevada Public Library Genealogy Room in the documents entitled "Genealogy from the Heartland." Mid-Continent also has the full Ancestry.com-Plus internet subscription as well as other genealogy subscription databases. Good preplanning will help you take full advantage of this research trip – please see the article below. You may take your lunch or there is a small café across the street from the library.

We will carpool from the northeast corner of the Wal-Mart parking lot at 7:15 a.m. The trip to Independence takes about 1 ½ hours and helping with gasoline expenses will be greatly appreciated by those driving. Please contact Nancy Malcom (667-2024) so we can ensure everyone has a ride.

# Preparing for a Research Trip

To get the most from a research trip, make a to-do list with specific research goals, collections you would like to search, and questions you would like to ask. Concentrate on using indexes, manuscript collections, unpublished records, rare books, photographs, and sources unique to the library where you are researching. Plan to use card files,

newspapers, original records, computer databases, networks, or compact discs that can only be searched at that repository. Consider also that it might have records that have not been microfilmed, such as church records.

Place your research goals, copies of your pedigree charts, and family group records in folders or notebooks. Plan to work only on a few family lines at a time. It would not be efficient to take all of your genealogy records with you. Be sure to keep a copy of your family records at home as well. You might also want to take a magnifying glass, a couple of extra pencils (no ink pens), and money for the copy machine.

Organize your information so you know what you already have and can determine what you need. You may want to write a brief narrative about the families you are going to work on, as well as prepare a timeline for the families.

## **Updates**

#### Workday June 2 to Sort Lathrop Collection

A workday will be held on June 2 to sort the genealogy collection. We will specifically sort out Cedar and Vernon County documents to be copied before placing in the libraries at El Dorado Springs and Nevada. These include: 1) newspaper indexes, 2) funeral home record indexes, 3) copies of funeral home records, and 4) plat books. (Additionally, the Nevada city and/or rural directories and originals of the marriage indexes will be sorted.) We can then estimate the expense of copying these documents and placing the pages in plastic sleeves and 3-ring binders for the libraries. If you would like to help sort, we will start at 10 a.m. in the Library meeting room (where our regular meetings are held) and hope to be completed later that day. **Bring a sack lunch.** If you have some extra boxes, please bring them also.

#### **Grant Possibilities for Funding of Duplicating, Sleeves, and Notebooks**

If you know of possible funding sources for the expense of 3-ring notebooks, plastic sleeves, and copying of the above listed documents, please contact the society. A couple of ideas are: 1) a Wal-Mart Matching Funds Grant which requires a fund-raiser by our organization and the limit of grant award is \$500 (Dorothy had suggested a yard sale to raise money); and 2) a Brownlee Grant from the State Historical Society (we presently have a Brownlee Grant for the re-printing of the Marriage Indexes and may not be able to get another grant from them this year but could apply). Due to the volume of materials, we can schedule the work in increments as we have funds available.

#### Sale of Microfilm Machine

A member recently met with three representatives of the Public Safety Office regarding the possible sale of the microfilm machine. They indicated interest; however, no offer has been received as of this time.

#### **Circuit Court Records Project**

Members got some hands-on experience with the Circuit Court Records Project at our May meeting. Records were cleaned, separated, and placed in folders during a workshop following the business meeting. Linda Myers, Field Archivist with the Missouri State Archives, was at the Vernon Co Courthouse on May 20 to work with us on the project and said that she was very pleased with the overall progress on the project and that we got so many records cleaned at the workshop. Anyone who would like to help further with this project can go to Room 9A at the Courthouse (to your left as you come off the elevator on Floor 1) on Fridays at 10 a.m.
