Tri-County Genealogical Society Featured on Internet Site

Over 1,200 "hits" (visits) have been recorded as of January 2, 2006 on the new Tri-County Genealogical Website which was recently posted on the Internet. The Internet address for the site is: <u>http://www.rootsweb.com/~motcogs/</u> "**motcogs**" may initially seem difficult to remember, but it breaks down this way: <u>mo</u> (Missouri) <u>tri</u> <u>co</u>unty <u>g</u>enealogical <u>s</u>ociety. The tilde (~) is found on your keyboard as the shift of the key to the left of number 1 – you'll want to bookmark this site to quickly find it in the future. Roots Web offers free Internet hosting to a variety of individuals and organizations, and we are now able to take advantage of having a website free of charge.

Some preliminary basic information was put together to begin the site, and we can now develop and expand it to include information which will be helpful to researchers and things which would be helpful to our members.

Your assistance is needed to further develop the website...what information would be helpful to researchers and what information would you like to see on the site? For instance, about 100 inquiries or more have been answered over the past 3 years about researching former patients at the Nevada State Hospital #3. Based on those inquiries and information gained in researching the State Hospital, the webpage

http://www.rootsweb.com/~motcogs/nevada_state_hosp.htm was created. We have information on researching deaths in Vernon County, but how do we research deaths in Cedar County and St. Clair? That can be added to the website if someone who knows that information will write it down and send it to the society. (Information cannot be put on the website if it is not known – your help is appreciated with this.) A list of Cedar County resources which are in the El Dorado Springs Library is also needed to put on the website. Please share you ideas about things to include on the website.

We recognize that all of our members do not use the internet. A printed copy of the entire website will be available at the January meeting for you to look at. The copy will then be placed in the Nevada Library Genealogy Dept. for reference.

Inquiry from Metz, France

Patrick Brophy (Bushwhacker Museum) referred an inquiry to the society from Julienne Fortel, Metz, France, regarding Metz, Missouri. Ms. Fortel is preparing a cultural exhibition about the exil of French East Protestants to America during the 17th and 18th centuries because of persecutions. She wanted to know if there was a connection between the two Metz's. Information from the 1911 History of Vernon Co. on the naming of Metz, MO was sent. Metz was originally named Pleasant Valley. When residents tried to get a Post Office, it was discovered that another town in Missouri already had that name. The Postmaster had been reading in a newspaper article on the Franco-Prussian War and General Bazaine's capitulation at Metz. He suggested the name Metz based on reading of the war, and the name was adopted and the post office obtained. This was in 1870, and the Metz Post Office is still in operation today.

North Dakota Death Index Online

If your research includes North Dakota, you may find the death record you're searching for in the new online searchable database at

Frieda Hickman reports that she found the birth and death date for one of her cousin's babies who died there. The baby lived only 1 day...now Frieda's research has dates for this youngest one, rather than blanks.

1890 Barton, Bates, Cass, Vernon Co, MO Veterans and Widows Census

Many libraries offer access to their Heritage Quest library subscription from your home computer by purchasing a library card (usually \$25 to \$30 annually). With the library card number, you can remotely connect to the Library's website and its Heritage Quest subscription and conduct your research from the comfort of your home. You can purchase the library card from Mid-Continent Library, Springfield Library, or as Betty H. has done, from Godfrey Memorial Library in Middletown, CT. This is an economical way to have access to the Federal Census (and other records) at home.
