
#### **New Format for Newsletter**

#### **Oct. 14 Monthly Meeting**

On October 14, we will carpool to Butler, MO, to join the Bates Co. Genealogical Society for a presentation by Mrs. Woodfin, a local genealogists who has been conducting



research for several years and has transcribed

and published many local records. The meeting will be at the Butler Public Library, 100 W. Atkinson Ave. Directions: From northbound on U.S. 71, exit Business 71 at Butler. Turn right (east) onto W. Nursery St. (about the first street). Proceed east to S. Delaware St. There is a library directional sign at this corner. Turn left (north) onto S. Delaware St. The library is on the west (left) side of the road at the corner of Delaware and Atkinson. We will help locate carpools from both El Dorado Springs (contact Luella P @ 876-2285 to coordinate) and from the Nevada Library (email the society) if needed. The Butler Library is open from 9:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. on Saturdays.

#### Workshops

**Thank you** to the several volunteers who came out a workshop where we put El Dorado Springs, MO, Funeral Home Records in protective plastic sleeves and binders. Approximately 40 binders of records were delivered to the El Dorado Springs Library to catalogue and place in its genealogy section. These records have some great details. The data from these records was abstracted and indexed by Wilma Lathrop, and copies of the abstracted data are in the El Do, Stockton, and Nevada libraries.

A second workshop was held and additional abstracted/indexed area newspaper indexes were put into protective sleeves and binders. Fifteen new newspaper index books have now been added to the Nevada Library Genealogy Department. The new indexes are of Nevada Daily Mail, Sheldon Enterprise, and Lamar Democrat newspapers. Additionally, copies of the Waggoner Funeral Home Records (Harwood, MO) have been put in sleeves and binders and copies placed in both the El Do and Nevada libraries.

## Vernon County Circuit Court Records Project

Work continues weekly on the Circuit Court Records Project, and we can always use more help to complete this large undertaking. Come to the Nevada Library on any Friday ~ work begins at 10 a.m. Most volunteers take a lunch break from 12 noon until 1 p.m., and then work continues until about 3 or 3:30 p.m. If you cannot work a full day, please work that portion that fits your schedule. The more people who help with this project, the sooner we can have these records available for researchers.

## Update ~ Newspaper Indexes on RootsWeb.com

Rootsweb.com is having a bit of a problem getting our indexes online, and we are patiently working with them to accomplish this. Two indexes are presently searchable at <u>http://userdb.rootsweb.com/news/</u>. They are the 1884 and1894 Nevada Daily Mail indexes. These are the new, every-name indexes which volunteers prepared for the newspaper index books. These will also soon be searchable directly from our website. Some indexes will be scanned and linked directly from our site at <u>http://www.rootsweb.</u> <u>com/~motcogs/gen rm resources.htm</u>. You will be able to browse, search, or print these Adobe pdf documents. Notices will be in the newsletter as these are available on the Internet.

All of the newspaper abstracted index books are now on the shelves in the Nevada Library Genealogy Department and are ready for use!!! However, new indexes do need to be prepared for about four more of the Sheldon Enterprise books. If you use a computer spreadsheet software program and would like to index one of these books, please contact Nancy T. A tremendous **thank you** to Darlene Lukenbill, Mary Alice Jeserick, and Becky Siple who are presently indexing books.

## **Preserving Microfilm**

While recently researching at the Missouri Historical Society's Newspaper Archives in Columbia, MO, and visiting with staff there, it was suggested that we monitor our collection of microfilm for "vinegar syndrome." Vinegar syndrome is a slow form of chemical deterioration which causes film to shrink, buckle, and emit a strong vinegar odor. State Historical Society staff recommended aciddetection strips, such as "A-D Strips," which will detect and measure the severity of vinegar syndrome. Film affected by vinegar syndrome should be removed from storage with other film and reproduced before it completely deteriorates and the vinegar syndrome affects nearby film. A-D Strips are packaged 250 detector strips and complete instructions for \$45. plus s/h. We will coordinate with the Director of the Library regarding this.

The Ottawa Co. Genealogical Society in Miami, OK, is holding its annual seminar on Nov 4 at the 1<sup>st</sup> Christian Church in Miami.
