# THE ORGANIZATION OF AN ORCHESTRA AT METZ IN 1936

Mr. Rush Crawford of Nevada organized an orchestra with an enrollment of 16 pupils on

The orchestra includes pupils from the grades as well as from high school and the following instruments are used: 13 violins, one viola, two cellos, three saxophones, one flute, one oboe, five coronets, five slide trombones, five drums, one symbol, one set bells, two melophones, one alto, piano, and one tuba.

Three free musical programs were presented for the entertainment of the public on the following dates; January 28, March 30, and May 5. Each program was enjoyed by a well filled auditorium.

The success of this undertaking was largely due to the untiring efforts of Mr. Crawford, Mrs. Holmes, the loyal support of the parents and community, and the intense enthusiasm of the pupils.

The collection of short stories will be compiled, edited, and published. Project details will be worked out as materials are received and additional information will be published in the next newsletter.


