METZ SCHOOL DISPLAY AT BUSHWHACKER MUSEUM AND PICTURES FROM PREVIOUS REUNIONS

The Bushwhacker Museum, 212 West Walnut Street, Nevada, will be showcasing a Metz School display during its 2009 season, Alumni are encouraged to May-October. come early on May 30th and visit the Museum to see the highlighted Metz display as part of the "Never Ending Story" of Vernon County, as well as the many other new exhibits in the Museum this year. A tour of the historic 1860s-era jail, now on the National Register of Historical Sites, is included in the Museum visit as well as a short introductory video. Additionally, there are exhibits on the Osage Indians, the Civil War, pioneer farming, and recreated rooms of an early 1900s doctor's office and home (that of Dr. Hornback, who practiced medicine in Metz before moving to Nevada more than 100 years ago). There is a large military display which will also be of special interest. Museum hours are 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. The fee for adults is \$3.

Our thanks to Robert Seater for coordinating and installing the Metz temporary exhibit at the Museum! Because items from the Metz Bank display are being used at the Bushwhacker Museum this season, the Bank at Metz will not be open during the 2009 reunion.

In conjunction with the Bushwhacker Museum visit, there will also be a special slide show of pictures from previous reunions shown in the Nevada Library Meeting Room. This is the room at the street level entrance to the Museum. The pictures will be shown continuously from 12 until 2 p.m.

We hope you will come early and enjoy lunch in Nevada, watch the slide show, and visit the Bushwhacker Museum prior to the evening Banquet at the Country Club.

DIRECTIONS TO NEVADA COUNTRY CLUB

From U.S. Hwy 54/West Austin Blvd. in Nevada, MO, turn south onto Spring Street. Proceed south and cross the railroad tracks (about 1.1 miles). Turn right (west) onto Country Club Drive at the sign and stay to the right at the Y. Proceed around the curve and up the hill to the Clubhouse. Parking is available around the circle drive. Enter via the ramp on the east side of the building.



MILITARY MEMORIAL DEDICATIONS HISTORIC BALLTOWN CEMETERY

In 2003 Metz School alumni Robert Seater (Class of '60 and retired U.S. Navy officer) personally undertook the renovation of historic Balltown Cemetery located west of Horton. He and his assistant, Steve 'Tex' McKinley (Class of 1983) have trimmed trees, removed brush, and installed a new chain link fence along the west side of the cemetery. They are repairing and resetting stones as needed across the cemetery. The Civil War lot has

been completely restored with new granite coping and engraved corner posts, and a new black granite memorial honoring all veterans and all branches of service was erected.

On November 9, 2008, several hundred people gathered at Balltown Cemetery for the rededication of the Mt. McGregor Post #252 Grand Army of the Republic Civil War burial lot and dedication of the new military memorial.

Arnold Schofield, historian with the Historical Society of Kansas, was master of ceremonies for the day's events. Participants in the Civil War burial lot rededication included Holmes' Brigade Civil War Reenactment Unit, Colonel John T. Coffee Camp 1934 Sons of Confederate Veterans, Phelps Camp 66 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, and Women's Relief Corps (portrayed by Cottey College students). The Cottey College Wind

Ensemble under the direction of Gary Johnson (Class of 1959 and Retired U.S. National Guard), provided patriotic music during the afternoon.

Participants in the dedication of the new military memorial included Mr. Schofield; Lawrence Cripps, U.S. Air Force, Retired; Nevada High School Air Force Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps; Bill Martin; State Representative Barney Fisher, 125th House District and Lt. Col. U.S. Marine Corps, Retired; and the 'Parade of the American Soldier.' The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2175, American Legion Leon Ogier Post 2; Sheldon American Legion Post 175; and the Vietnam Veterans of America Don E. Pollock Chapter 918 participated in laying of the wreath at the new memorial. The Butler American Legion James P. Arnold Post 46 provided the gun salute and "Taps" was by Cottey College buglers.

During the ceremony, State Rep. Barney Fisher presented Seater with a Missouri State House Resolution honoring his volunteer work in the cemetery. Additionally, Patty (Shields) Edmonds Vacca (class of 1948) presented both Seater and McKinley

> with plaques on behalf of the community, thanking them for their work.
