HONORING METZ ALUMNI VETERANS WHO SERVED DURING PEACETIME AND WAR

To our Alumni Veterans, we would like to say "Thank you for your service to our country!" Last year's newsletter as well as this 2010 edition is dedicated to our Alumni Veterans as well as any veteran who attended Metz School.

The following are Veterans who have served since World War II. Alumni were asked to send a picture and brief paragraph about their service. Some entries are not complete with rank, and parental information. What is seen is what has been provided.

Harold D. Brewer. Corporal Harold Brewer son of Roy and Iva Brewer, and husband of

June Ann Handly graduated from Metz in He entered the 1948. Army in 1951; he went to Fort Knox, KY for training before going to Korea. He Served in the 73rd Tank Division from 1952 1954.



Lewis W. Buhr, served in the Marine Corps from May 1952 to May 1958. Lewis trained in San Diego and Camp Pendleton, California. He was then transferred to Air Wing and finished his training on the East Coast.

Billie Joe Brooks.

Billie Cpt. Brooks graduated from Metz in 1963. He entered the Army in June 1967 and served as a signal Officer 1/5 BN, 25th Infantry Division. in Vietnam.



He also served as Company, C Co, 125 Sig BN-25th Infantry Division, Vietnam.

Joe also served as Brigade Signal Officer, 1st Bge, and 1st Inf. Div. He was awarded the Bronze Star and Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters. He was discharged in August 1972.

Edith Charles Collins.

Cadet Nurse Edith Charles, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Charles and the wife of Lewis F. Collins, graduated from Metz High School in



1942. She entered the United States Cadet Nurse Corps in July 1943, in Fort Scott, Kansas. Edith trained in Fort Scott. Kansas and graduated in September 1945.

Louis A. "Jack" Finwick.

Pfc. Jack Finwick, son of Elmer Finwick, graduated from Metz in 1951. He entered the Army in May 1954 and received his basic training in Fort Chaffee, Arkansas. He served in Augsburg, Germany from January 1955 to April 1956. He served in the positions of Communications. 42 Mortar Gunner, was



Flame Thrower Certified, and also served as a Mail Clerk. He received Medals for Good Conduct and European Theater.

Gary L. Johnson. Son of John and Hazel Johnson, husband of Lora Baze, graduated from Metz in 1959. He served in the United States Army from 1966 to 1969, spending one year in Vietnam. Gary then served 30 years in the Missouri Army National Guard, retiring as Chief Warrant Officer 4.



Charles "Charlie" Morris. Son of Ted and Ellen Morris of Kansas City, KS, husband of Dorothy Shrum, attended Metz from 1952 to 1954. He moved back to Kansas City, KS his Senior year and entered the United States Air Force in

November 1954 where he received his GED. Basic training was completed at Parks AFB, California. He also received training at Tech School as Jet Engine Mechanic at Chanute AFB, Rantoul II. He married Dorothy in June of 1956 then in August he was off to the 32nd Tac Recon Unit stationed at Spangdahlem. Germany where Dorothy joined him in 1956. Unit transferrd to Phalsbourg, France in July 1957. Back to the states in Feb. 1959 ending his active military duty. Charlie then worked for TWA and went to A & P school, also tried various other civilian jobs. Sept. 1961, joined the USAF 422nd Continental Air Command at Richards-Gebaur AFB as a Reserve Technician/Civil Service and was recalled to active duty in Oct. for the Berlin Crisis. In 1968 became a flight engineer for the C124 aircraft then later the C130. From 1959 to 1981, serving as a reserve technician, his duties took him through the Vietnam conflict, the Central America conflict, Korea and to every continent. In 1981 he moved to New York with the FAA and transferred to the Air National Guard 602nd Air Rescue Unit out of Riverhead Long Island. In 1985, due to a transfer by the FAA to Washington, D.C., he retired from his military/reserve duties. In 1987 he transferred back with the FAA in Kansas City, retired from the FAA in 1994 and continues to be involved with the airplane industry through his DAR function for the FAA with his own consulting company. Many awards and accolades, too numerous to mention, in his almost 40 years of service to his country and the government.

Edgar J. Pullin. Sfc. Edgar Pullin, son of Roland and Mildred Pullin, graduated from



Metz in 1962. He entered the United States Army in 1964 where he received his basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO.

In 1965 he trained at Ft. Ord, California -AIT. Then in 1966 Fort at Rucker. Alabama. Auenition-1966. From 1966 -1968 he was stationed Fort in Benning, Georgia. He served in Alaska from 1968-1971, Korea from 1973-1974, Fort Eustis,

Virginia-Tech school from 1974 to 1983, Germany 1983-1985 and in Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1985-1986 when he retired. Edgar received two Metorious Awards, two Achievement Awards and five Good Conduct Awards.

Joe Rinehart.

Msqt. Joe Rinehart after graduating from Metz attended for two years at the University of Missouri-Columbia, then transferred to Southwest Missouri State in Springfield. He then taught school for one year.



Joe became interested in the National Guard and spent two years working as a civilian doing administrative work.

Joe then joined the United States Air Force and spent twenty-one years with the Air Force retiring as a Master Sergeant in October 1972. He spent two years in England, one in Korea, and one in Vietnam. After Vietnam he spent 10 ½ years at Forbes AFB in Topeka, KS. He was awarded the Presidental Unit Citation, Air Force Good Conduct with four oak leaf clusters, Air Force Longevity Service Award Ribbon with four bronze oak leaf clusters, Air Force NCO PME graduate, National Defense Service Medal with one bronze star, Korean Service Medal with two bronze stars, Vietnam Service Medal, Small Arms Expert Marksmanship ribbon, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Palm and the United Nations Service Medal.

Robert E. Seater. Lt. Robert Seater, son of

Mr. Albert Seater graduated from Metz in 1960. He enlisted in the United States Navy in June 1960. Bob recevied his basic training San at Diego, California and was assigned engineering the rating of Machinist Mate.



He advanced to Master Chief Petty Officer, chief Warrant Officer and retired as a Line Officer. While on active duty, attended San Diego State University, graduated with a Bachelor's and Master's Degrees. He was a member of the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, the highest all-university academic honor students may receive.

Bob served on seven ships: USS Richard B. Anderson (DD-786), San Diego, Ca., USS Stoddard (DD-556), San Diego, Ca., USS Unley (AS-31). Holy Loch, Scotland, USS

Tanner (AGS-15), Pearl Harbor, HI.,USS Kitty Hawk (CV-63), San Diego, CA., USS Ranger (CV-61), San Diego, CA., USS Jason (AR-8), San Diego, California. He also received the following medals during his service: Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal, Navy Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Navy Expert Pistol Shot Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon and Navy "E" Ribbon. He retired from the Navy on April 1, 1982 after 21 ½ years of service.




Joe Willis.

were the first group of trainees since the Korean conflict. When setting the up microphones on the stands, I noticed they were having problems with wrapping the cords I showed them how to around the stand. turn the stand portion into the microphone, thus avoiding wrapping the cord around the stand. The person in charge of special service asked how I knew this and I explained my band and music experience. He asked me to be on the show and approved it through my sergeant. I had a repitoire of what now is considered "classic rock" songs, and this went over well and made me very popular with the other recruits. What started out to be a punishment detail turned into a very profitable experience as I performed many paid concerts, shows, and dances for the Special Service during my tour of duty at Ft. Rucker. It helped me pay off my '65 Mustang, pay for insurance and for my dates.


